TheDepartment of Surgical Gastroenterology started its functioning from 2018 at Super specialty Hospital, GMC, Srinagar thus, adding to the spectrum of Super specialty care in the Oldest Medical Institution of the State for patients which, otherwise would get referred to either SKIMS or outside the erstwhile J&K State. It caters to the benign & malignant surgical disorders of GI & HPB (Gastrointestinal tract, Liver, Pancreas & Biliary system) system. It is mandated by the Government and its regulatory bodies with adequately Qualified & Trained team to impart Safe & Quality Surgical procedures along with, Training & Education of future Surgical Gastroenterologists (GI & HPB Surgeons).

#### **MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS:**

 The Department was recognized by the National Board (MoH&FW) for conducting Post-Doctoral Super specialtyDrNB in Surgical Gastroenterology in 2019 & since then every year, students from different parts of the country opt for perusing their Post-Doctoral DrNB Degrees in the Department.


- 2. First Department to issue comprehensive and typed discharge summaries to the patients in prescribed format with clear mention of all the "events" in the hospital thus, adding transparency to the system and leading the way.
- 3. All operative records and follow up of the patients are stored in a computerized format for easy retrieval and reference for the first time in history of GMC & Associated Hospitals, thus contributing significantly to the genuinedata on local population. This was remarkably done in the absence of any secretarial staff and shortage of residents & faculty.
- 4. In a short span of time the Department of Surgical Gastroenterology became a high volume center for HPB Surgeries & GI malignancies in the region.
- 5. The Department continued to operateGI/HPB Malignancies even during COVID-19 pandemic waves when other referral hospitals had stopped their surgeries.
- 6. The Department of Surgical Gastroenterology, GI & HPB Oncosurgeryboasts of having:
  - Performed Pancreatico-duodenectomy on youngest patient (4 years old) & oldest patient (83 years old); both surviving with almost 2 years follow up.
  - Performed a large series on major hepatectomies on patients with alveolar hydatid of liver at present.
  - Performed a large series on re-operative surgeries in the state, on patients referred for surgical complications.
  - First Department in the region to introduce Laparoscopic Portal vein ligation to proceed with staged hepatectomies in unresectable liver lesions.


#### Remarkable Research & Publications:


- 1. The Department currently runs multiple research projects on GI/HPB disorders especially foregut malignancies.
